

Code of Conduct for Squash Players

By signing this form, you here by agree to the following code of conduct, which sets out a standard of behaviour expected when entering the squash court to protect the courts, club, members, non-members and the public.

- 1. Players must be familiar with the rules of Squash and make every effort to comply with them, for each players own safety.
- 2. Only non-marking and clean shoes are acceptable. Please check with the leisure centre staff or a committee member if you are unsure on this.
- 3. Players must respect the rights of others and behave with dignity on court. Do not abuse or harass other members with actions or words, place them in danger, treat them in a discriminatory way, or take advantage of them.
- 4. Rackets are not to be hit against the wall or floor intentionally in anger or frustration.
- 5. Player's hands, arms, legs and face, etc., should be clean of any material (paint, oil, mud, etc.) that could mark the side walls or flooring.
- 6. Do not run into or up the walls (particularly on our boarded wall courts).
- 7. No food or drinks are to be taken on court.
- 8. Non-members must fill out a contact details form before playing. This is for HSE and insurance requirements in managing the sports centre.
- 9. Most importantly, enjoy the game of squash!

Note: The Harleston Tennis & Squash Club Committee has the right to ban players from the club if players do not adhere to the Code of Conduct and / or unwelcome behaviour or damage has occurred. They also have the right to charge members and non-members for any malicious damage that has happened to the clubs premises.

If you are unsure on the rules of squash please see the boards outside the court or contact a member of the committee who will happily explain. Contact details are found on the notice board.
